- Juniors wishing to race to the top must ride in their respective licensed category (1,2,3,4). Entry is free to juniors in any category. Juniors racing to Junior Finish line should review race map for finish line location at 11.1 miles.
- BAR/BAT results will be pulled out of all categories.
- Field Limits – Maximum number of riders allowed to the top is 1200.
- Individual Field limits apply.

ROAD CLOSURE – CO 5 – ECHO LAKE TO THE SUMMIT

- The top portion of the course from Echo Lake to the summit of the mountain will be closed to traffic. Only those vehicles authorized to follow the race (the caravan) as designated by the Race Director will be allowed to follow the riders. There will be no exceptions.
- There will be limited seats available for riders to come down in the caravan vehicles. Riders should plan to put extra clothing in their bags that will be transported to the top so that they may ride down to Echo Lake to meet their rides.
- Vehicles meeting riders will be asked to wait in designated areas along CO 103. **We will not allow any cars to park at Echo Lake.** There will be a small area for loading riders so it is important to calculate the time your rider will take and only come to the loading area when that time comes. Vehicles will be asked to move if they are parked in this area too long.
- **Vehicles will not be allowed to park at the Echo Lake Lodge or the fishing/picnic area at Echo Lake.**
- Vehicles are asked to wait at the middle school or parking lots in Idaho Springs until it is time to pick up riders.

- The Middle School will be open beginning at 6:30 a.m. for bathrooms and people can wait for riders there.
- Vehicles not cooperating may receive civil penalties from law enforcement and riders associated with any vehicle penalized will be disqualified from the event.

EXTRA CLOTHING

Bring two sets of warm clothes - one to send to the top and the other to keep on while you warm up before the race.

Please bring warm, old clothing to put into a bag labeled with your name and category. This will help you when you reach the top to avoid being cold or dressed inappropriately for the weather conditions that may exist. **RACE IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANYTHING LOST, STOLEN OR MISPLACED.**

CLOTHING VEHICLES_ - NEW PROCEDURE FOR 2010! Bring two sets of warm clothes - one to send to the top and the other to keep on while you warm up before the race.

In an effort to further reduce the caravan size, there will be only 2 clothing vehicles going to the top. The first clothing vehicle will leave ahead of the Citizen Wave at 7:20. The second vehicle will leave prior to the SM 35+ category. You will not be able to access your clothing bag once you check it with the volunteers.

There will be a “coat check” at the start where you can leave your warm-up clothing.

Your clothing bags will be placed numerically on tarps at the top of the mountain. Volunteers will be present to assist you. In the event you do not get your clothing from the vehicle, the bags will be left with the Judge's car at the top and ultimately will be brought down to the school.

FOLLOW VEHICLES

Follow vehicles are there for your safety during the ride and to help transport riders down from the top. **DO NOT PUT CLOTHES IN THESE VEHICLES.** These vehicles can carry wheels but there is no guarantee that they will be near you should you need assistance. Each vehicle is covering a large number of riders.

FOOD/LIQUIDS

You will be riding at altitude so keep drinking fluids. The race provides water at Echo Lake, the summit and the bottom of the mountain. Take two or three bottles with you. Remember to pack an energy bar or other food with you.

TRASH

Please do not throw any trash on the mountain. It is a special place and we want to continue to use it. Please put trash in your pockets and dispose of trash receptacles at the top and at the school. Littering will result in immediate disqualification.

AFTER-PARTY and AWARD CEREMONIES

This year's awards and ceremonies will take place in downtown Idaho Springs proper. Racers will receive a voucher in their race packet that will be good for a meal at one of our participating food vendors who will also offer a meal option for friends and family at a reasonable price. More details will be sent to registered racers.

TOP 25 RECEIVE PRIORITY IN EACH CATEGORY

We will compile the top 25 in each category as a priority. All finished riders will receive a placing but we must get our awards ceremonies completed efficiently. If you finished outside the top 25 and do not wait you will be allowed to protest on the web for 72 hours after posting of all results.

TOP 25 MUST WAIT AT RACE SITE FOR RESULTS UNLESS INDICATED OTHERWISE BY THE OFFICIALS.

Prizes are given out as the officials declare them final throughout the day. Awards cannot start until the officials have declared the top places final. Please be patient as everyone works as hard as they can to get things done quickly but we have 28 miles between the top and the bottom of the mountain. We cannot give out prizes until the results are official and final for those placings. The officials produce the results. Results must be posted for 15 minutes. Please do not leave if you have won a prize. If you leave you must check with the race organizer to see if the medal/prize will be mailed to you. The promoter is under no obligation to send your prize in the mail. Prize list placings take precedence over other places for posting. Results needing to be corrected outside the prize list will be completed but not in the same priority as those affecting the prize list.

ANY CITIZEN JERSEY NOT PICKED UP BY END OF RACE DAY WILL BE FORFEITED.

REFUNDS/RACE CANCELLATION

There are no refunds as a general rule. However, in the event that the race is cancelled before race day the promoter will make a best effort to refund a portion of each entry fee (once non-refundable race expenses have been determined) by the race organizer. Any refund checks owed will be mailed within 60 days of race cancellations. No refund will be given for cancellations on race day due to weather or other considerations outside the control of the race promotion.
